OVERVIEW – WHO IS LIMBE WILDLIFE CENTRE

The Limbe Wildlife Centre was created in 1993 as a result of the rapid decline of animal populations in Cameroon, due to habitat degradation, poaching, and the illegal wildlife trade. Run in partnership between the non-profit organisation Pandrillus and the Government of Cameroon, our project is unique in Central Africa. Our mission is to ensure the survival and protection of Cameroonian wildlife. Our team is composed of local and international wildlife ecologists and veterinarians, and a highly experienced and qualified local animal care staff.



We also run an intensive education programme within the communities to help them understand the importance and value of protecting our unique wildlife.

The Limbe Wildlife Centre is also a proud founding and accredited member of the **Pan African Sanctuary Alliance**¹, and the only recipient of a **Clark R. Bavin Wildlife Law Enforcement Award** (2019).

- 3. Engage the community to support nature conservation
- 4. Promote animal welfare and conservation
- 5. Rescue, rehabilitate and release all rescued wildlife

CONTEXT

Our planet is now in the midst of its sixth mass extinction of plants and animals, due to human's actions. Cameroon's wildlife is not spared and already has several extinct species to lament: the Cheetah, the Black Rhinoceros and the Wild dog. To instigate a change of behaviour, develop a sense of ownership and engage the community to protect wildlife, it is critical that everybody is aware of the value of biodiversity and ecosystem services to human health, tourism, economy, and culture. With the COVID-19 spreading through all continents and affecting each society, every human must rethink its relationship with nature, and reinvent the link between nature and societies. In traditional African culture, especially in Cameroon, Africa in miniature, respect for nature and wildlife was essential.

That is the reason why **Toh Bright** chose the Limbe Wildlife Centre to begin his journey and remind us all about the importance to keep **healthy ecosystems**.












ACTIVITIES

Toh Bright will illustrate 4 major programmes run at the **Limbe Wildlife Centre:** the endangered African grey parrot rehabilitation and release; community-based conservation; conservation education and the rehabilitation of endangered primate's species of the South-West Region of Cameroon. The **4 billboards** (4m x 2m) will be displayed in the community to emphasize the actions taken by the Limbe Wildlife Centre to protect Cameroon's unique wildlife.






TIMEFRAME

The preliminary work has started in December 2019 and the final design should be done by the end of March. We aim at printing and inaugurating the billboards as soon as funds are available, ideally before **June 2020**.

FUNDING GOALS

The budget required to **design**, **produce** and **inaugurate** the 4 billboards is \$7,016 (3.9M FCFA), of which +50% will **directly benefit the artist** and serve to set his future goals. So far, we have secured 24% of the total budget.



EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Raise awareness among Cameroonians to the social, economic and cultural value of protecting wildlife
- Communicate and promote current initiatives in Cameroon regarding the protection of wildlife and how it benefits human wellbeing
- 3. Raise awareness among people about **animal welfare**
- 4. Support Cameroonian artists and activists to become a spokesperson and an ambassador to nature protection
- Develop a sound communication strategy to engage the authorities and people through social and traditional media

FUTURE PLANS

- We want to design and run a public sensitization campaign to engage the community specifically, alongside the African grey parrot rehabilitation and release programme
- To enhance our visual identify to optimize and maximize educational impacts of the Limbe Wildlife Centre.
